RYECAT - Community Transport

RYECAT Ltd is a community transport company which tries to fill the gaps between public transport services; as a charity it makes no profit. It runs the Malton-Norton-Wolds Ring & Ride service, a project called Wheels2Work which hires mopeds to 16-25-year-olds who could otherwise not get to work, education or training. It also runs school transport and a few minibus services. Most important to people in Hovingham and Scackleton is the Ryedale Car Scheme. A Car Scheme driver will collect you from home, take you where you need to go (which might be a hospital or surgery, but does not have to be), bring you home again, having waited, if need be, for a couple of hours. All the passenger has to do is pay the driver for the fuel, at about 40p per mile.

Passengers do have to register with RYECAT first.
